SPECIAL PROJECTS

• Online Learner Training Programs

A project team from the School of Language Studies and Linguistics, Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia are currently undertaking a research project to develop online learner training programs that can be used in the teaching and learning of English language and literature for first year undergraduates. The aim of the project is to empower learners to come to terms with their strengths and weaknesses in order to learn efficiently in ways, which are compatible with their personalities, identities and socio-cultural contexts. It is also to promote greater autonomy among these students. The project involves carrying out a questionnaire survey to identify Malaysian learners' characteristics and designing on-line learner training components to supplement the present face-to-face classroom teaching. The fund for this project is provided by the National Council for Scientific Research and Development in Malaysia. The project team would like to invite APACALL members embarking on similar projects to contact them to share knowledge and exchange information. • Anti-SARS Networking Project

A project from Youth Knowledge Network, Taiwan. [<u>http://ajet.ykn.org.tw</u>]. It is not only a language learning program, but a trans-disciplinary project. CALL plays an important part of the project, not just with respect to research side but with its very application to K-12 teaching. Youth Knowledge Network is currently coordinating different forces in ICT, cultural and arts, medical (including psychiatrical analysis) of the POST-SARS phenomena. The second stage of the project is focused on how to teach students to express themselves in describing SARS situation. It will also be developed online as a networking youth leader training program that can be used as a model of content-based English language. The aim of the project in linguistic aspect is to empower teachers to conduct their courses on-line through stream technology, going with video conferencing tools and adopting the speech content discourse as the main source of action research.
